Confusion on the Day of Bunker Hill(York soldiers on the day of the battle); John Adams from York to Independence(the life of Adams after he was in York in 1774); July 1777. . .The York Men who Faced Burgoyne(Town soldiers at Ticonderoga based on Bragdon letters);Valley Forge readied the forces to win the war(York's experience at the famous winter encampment); They Sailed with John Paul Jones(York men who were sailors in his raiding expeditions); The Penobscot Disaster of 1779(how York was involved in the naval disaster); The Massachusetts Constitution of 1780; Ratifying the Constitution in 1788; An Obedient Servant to Alexander Hamilton(Joseph Tucker as Customs Collector and his Letterbook from the 1790s); To be published A Workhouse for the Poor(Attitudes towards poverty)
